The COVID-19 pandemic has disproportionately impacted minority populations worldwide, yet research on the experiences of migrants in Japan remains limited. This presentation aims to explore the challenges migrants faced during the crisis and their effects on well-being. By analyzing open-ended responses from a questionnaire survey conducted in October 2021, I first identify the most commonly reported difficulties and compare them to those experienced by Japanese nationals. Additionally, through regression analysis, I examine which difficulties reduce migrants' willingness to continue living in Japan and investigate the socio-environmental factors that may help mitigate these challenges.
