“Is science informing policy? Freshwater eels and CITES – a case study”

CITES (the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora) is an agreement between governments aiming to ensure that international trade in wild animals and plants does not threaten their survival. In recent years, there have been an increasing number of aquatic species listed in CITES, including the European eel in 2007.

This is a species which has a complex life history and plays a significant socio-economic role both across its range and in countries where it is traded and consumed. This presentation, based on both my biological and policy experience, will characterise the situation over the past 15-20 years and examine how effectively science has been incorporated into management decisions for the European eel, and by association, other freshwater eels.

“Memory and History of Russo-Japanese relations at the beginning of the 20th century”

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Recent years have seen a substantial number of studies proving that, after the war of 1904–1905, there was geopolitical rapprochement between the two countries, and, during the First World War, the two countries were de facto allies. This strongly challenges the simplified idea that, in the first half of the 20th century, the two countries were in a state of constant confrontation.

Obviously, one cannot deny the fact that there were regular moments of tension and even armed conflicts between the two countries during that period, but it was not a case of systemic confrontation that lasted four decades. Periods of aggravation in relations were followed by periods of de-escalation, and sometimes even rapprochement.

However, for some reason, in the post-war period, the facts of rapprochement were forgotten. The report will focus on interesting but little-known events of this period. In addition, the report will also focus on why these facts were forgotten.
