“Nation, state, and the modern international system in East Asia”

In this short seminar, I share my thoughts on issues in the development of modern international system in 20th century East Asia. The modern states system ideally consists of sovereign, territorial states of nations operating on the Westphalian principles. The shaping of the system in East Asia evolved in a particular direction, influenced by three sets of challenges. 1) civil conflicts dominated nation building processes after the collapse of the imperial systems; 2) states were built on divided nations after World War II; 3) Waves of industrial development eroded national boundaries and enhanced the power of the state. It was the global power structures that determined the character of the emergent international order in East Asia, more so than the institutional values, and ethnic, cultural and civilizational identities of the nations in question.

「ロシアのウクライナ軍事侵攻後における 戦争移民についての近年の展開」

The Russian military invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 has triggered a massive displacement of refugees and war migrants. This report presents recent developments in the anthropological study of this phenomenon. It begins by outlining scholarly trends that frame the Ukraine war as a "neo-colonial" event. Next, it examines the distinct characteristics of migrants from various ethnic groups, including ethnic Russians, and their reception in host countries. The report then highlights recent research on the reactions of Siberian indigenous peoples to the war, focusing on their responses both at home and abroad. Ultimately, this analysis will explore the complex entanglement of indigeneity with displacement, arguing that this relationship presents significant challenges for future research.
